#### **Business Meeting:**

Roll Call was taken and a quorum was established. Commissioner Dave Kerner made a motion to approve the Agenda and upon a second by Chief Judge Krista Marx the motion passed unanimously. Mr. Joseph lanno, Jr., made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 29, 2018 full CJC meeting and upon a second by Commissioner Dave Kerner, the motion passed unanimously.

Vice-Chair Barry Krischer, in the absence of Chair Gerald Richman, explained the purpose of the Annual Planning Meeting as discussing and establishing priorities for the coming year. He welcomed the members and guests and stressed the importance of the annual meeting.

### **Annual Planning Meeting:**

Executive Director Kristina Henson welcomed faculty from Florida State University and Florida Atlantic University, as well as, the Florida State Court Administrator, Patricia Jameson and County Administrator, Verdenia Baker.

### **Updates on Crime Trends and Program Performance Indicators:**

Mr. Damir Kukec presented the 2017 Crime Trends Report and Program Monitoring and Evaluation Outcomes Report. Following the presentation, there was general discussion of the findings, as well as, a question and answer period.

#### **Updates on the 2017 CJC Priorities:**

- MacArthur Safety and Justice Challenge: Kristina Henson gave updates on the recent activities and meetings, including last week's two-day site visit with MacArthur's Director of Justice Reforms, Laurie Garduque. Director Henson outlined various upcoming activities and strategies including the pretrial risk assessment instrument and racial and ethnic disparity projects. Bert Winkler gave an overview of the court date reminder and Frequent Users Systems Engagement (FUSE) Projects. Damir Kukec reviewed the data dashboard, data capacity building and collection, as well as, the case profession initiative. Director Henson and Damir Kukec acknowledged cooperation with data access from the Clerk and Comptroller's, Sheriff's and Pre-Trail Services offices. Director Henson introduced new staff member, Aleita Kinman, who will be working on racial and ethnic disparity issues.
- Reentry Program and Task Force: Craig Spatara gave an update of the Reentry Program, focusing on employment, sustainability, and sharing the success of the program through technical assistance to other states. Reverend Kevin L. Jones made a motion for the CJC Chair to draft a letter to the Economic Council to assist with the creation of job opportunities for reentry clients. Upon a second by Ms. Carey Haughwout, the motion passed unanimously.
- Community Engagement Task Force: Co-Chairs Chief Sarah Mooney and Barbara Cheives gave an overview of the Task Force, including the production of a resource guide, results and challenges of recent public events and future meetings.
- Body Worn Camera Committee: Co-Chair Commissioner Dave Kerner pointed out that the
  purpose of the committee has been fulfilled related to examining the issues, the technology,
  the costs and building a clearinghouse for information and listing of deployment status of local
  law enforcement agencies on the CJC website. He recommended that the committee sunset
  until a future need to re-convene is indicated. Members agreed.

#### **Determination of 2018 CJC Priorities:**

There were several priorities identified for consideration. After general discussion, members determined the following priorities for 2018:

- MacArthur Safety and Justice Challenge
- Community Engagement Task Force
- Palm Beach County Adult Drug Court numbers
- Elder Abuse Prevention

• School Safety referral to LEPC for ideas on needed actions

#### **Key Note Speaker:**

During a working lunch, Rachel Sottile-Logvin, Vice President of the Pretrial Justice Institute, spoke about the state of pretrial justice in America. This was based on a recent report done by PJI where a report card was done on each state. She spoke of reform initiatives involving money bail and risk assessment instruments in various states such as New Jersey.
