2.	Analysis of population being served to determine why most of the Public Defender’s clients are not eligible for services. Identify and address any deficiency.	<i>Refer to SJC Core Team.</i>
3.	Racial Equity and demographics focus throughout all the CJC’s work to ensure the community voice is heard and considered.	<i>CJC Admin is embarking on this initiative.</i>
4.	Returning Citizen and/or a HealthCare District member should be added to the CJC Board, by revision of CJC Ordinance and Bylaws.	<i>CJC approval to make request to BOCC and amend bylaws accordingly.</i>
5.	Social workers and mental health workers assigned to assist municipal law enforcement on homelessness calls.	<i>Refer to LEPC’s School &amp; Community Safety subcommittee</i>
6.	More connection and collaboration with the Reentry Task Force. Need for more workforce training during incarceration and access to more training and career paths upon reentry.	<i>Refer to Public Safety Department/ Reentry Taskforce.</i>
7.	Make recommendations to the BOCC to establish a Youth Reentry program, with support from community and DJJ.	<i>Refer to Public Safety Department/ Reentry Taskforce.</i>
8.	iCard Program to help reduce recidivism. CJC can do a cost analysis for law enforcement dissemination and the commitment to use the program.	<i>CJC Admin implement and evaluate this initiative.</i>
9.	More progress on Racial Equity is needed with full commitment from system players. All CJC Members and committee members take the REI training to help all fully understand implied and implicit bias and its impact on criminal justice and society in general.	<i>CJC Admin supports; however more discussion is needed pertaining to HB 7.</i>
10.	Reentry procedures are needed, including peer support, job training, goals and objectives to set up for success, a “See It- Be It” model, to start during incarceration and continue into the reentry process.	<i>Refer to Public Safety Department/ Reentry Taskforce.</i>
