






#### **Top Correspondences Per County Department**

### Investigation #2014-0005 Delray Beach – Trash Cart Purchase

- ➤ The City Manager and Department Director misled their Commission into approving a *future* purchase of trash carts, even though they had already been purchased.
- ➤ The ongoing purchase of trash carts had been procured without competition as required by City procurement procedures.

suspended and
subsequently
negotiated a
settlement to
resign.

The Department
Director
tendered her
resignation.

### Questioned Costs: \$297,714.04

The City has implemented all Corrective Actions recommended by the OIG. The City is currently in the process of reviewing their procurement procedures, updating IT processes, and implementing refresher training for staff.

#### **Contract Oversight**

PREVENTION: To reduce the appearance and opportunity of vendor favoritism and inspire public confidence that contracts are being awarded equitably and economically, Contract Oversight staff routinely attend selection committee meetings and perform contract oversight activities.

## Contract Oversight Notification 2014-N-0004 City of Delray Beach – Beach Concession for the Publicly Owned Beach

- Solicitation Document did not provide sufficient information for potential vendors.
- Selection Committee Members were not adequately trained, which led to confusion during the evaluation process.

# First Report: The decision to competitively procure the Beach Concession contract increased the City's annual concession fee (revenue) by \$136,242 more than it would have otherwise received.

#### **Corrective Action:**

- Include all relevant information that would assist vendors in preparing responses.
- Develop a Policy/Procedure for training of selection committee members.



Contract Oversight Notification 2014-N-0005
City of Delray Beach – Beach Concession for the Publicly Owned Beach

Unclear solicitation specifications resulted in confusion among vendors, the City Commission, and City staff.

#### **Corrective Action:**

Develop, or incorporate within an existing Policy/Procedure, the process by which critical bid specification language is developed, documented, and communicated.

Second Report: After issuing Notification 2014-N-0004, the OIG received a complaint concerning a material change to the solicitation document and resulting contract.

Unclear language in the solicitation document resulted in confusion and raised questions about the fundamental fairness of the procurement process.



Contract Oversight Notification 2014-N-0003

Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department – Contract Review Committee

Policy and Procedure Memorandum

Staff from the Water Utilities Department were unprepared to answer questions, resulting in a delayed vendor payment.



Current Policy does not require department staff to have sufficient knowledge related to the project/contract paperwork that has been submitted for approval.

### **Corrective Action Water Utilities Department:**

The Water Utilities Department should ensure that staff attending Contract Review Committee meetings have sufficient knowledge to answer the Committee's questions.


### Corrective Action Office of Financial Management & Budget:

Amend current Policy to require that staff attending the meetings have adequate knowledge concerning project/contract paperwork submitted for approval.



## **Contract Oversight Review 2014-R-0002 Municipality Contract Monitoring Survey**

Initiated a contract monitoring survey of Palm Beach County's thirty-eight municipalities to determine the robustness of their contract monitoring programs.

## Audit Report 2014-A-0004 City of South Bay Property, HR, and Payroll

- ➤ City owned property not accounted for; \$315,859 in equipment written off without supporting documentation.
- ➤ Potential to increase revenue by evaluating uses for \$2.9M in City owned property. Some City property in state of disrepair.
- ➤ Identified salary and benefits of \$21,934 paid to former Director of Code Enforcement with no measurable benefit.

### **Questioned Costs \$419,015**

#### **Corrective Action:**

- City is implementing new policies/procedures
- Addressing City owned assets
- 16 of 23 recommendations implemented

Second of two reports on South Bay. First audit identified questioned costs of \$306,377 and referred questionable items to State Attorney. Former City Manager is currently awaiting trial.

### Audit Report 2014-A-0002 Follow-Up Audit Palm Tran Connection

- Corrective action taken on all 12 recommendations from the prior audit; however, action not fully effective on 4 recommendations.
- Areas needing further action:
  - Better segregation of purchasing duties
  - Inventory of spare parts not maintained
  - No formal building access control policy
  - More timely implementation of audit recommendations

Original Audit Report issued
December 2011, which identified
purchasing control weaknesses that
allowed theft of office supplies over a
three-year period.

#### **Corrective Action:**

- Thorough review of purchasing duties annually
- Inventory of spare parts completed
- Formal access control policy developed
- Tracking system to confirm timely corrective action



Audit: January 1, 2014 - June 30, 2014

### Audit Report 2014-A-0003 Town of Briny Breezes Review of Expenditures

- Lack of competitive procurement for two contracts.
- No signed contract for one of the two vendors paid over \$44,000 in FY 2012.
- Incomplete documentation for two expenditures and one large inter-fund transfer of \$50,000.

Town had expenditures totaling approximately \$877,000 in Fiscal Year 2012

### **Corrective Action:**

- Revised policy and will competitively bid both contracts
- Town seeking signed contract with vendor
- Town will ensure adequate documentation is maintained for all expenditures
- > Town Council will approve all fund transfers



### LAWSUIT STATUS UPDATE



- ➤ The 2011 municipal lawsuit challenging the requirement to pay a share of OIG funding has now been placed on the trial docket for the third time, this time for August 18<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup>.
- While the lawsuit has been placed on the trial docket, two other cases currently have priority. Therefore, we are uncertain if the case will get to trial this month.
